PEILLE VILLAGE

The **Monaco Gravel Tour** will take place in **Peille Village-Grimaldi, Monaco**, at the [Mary Garden Place here](#) (click on the link).

A village perched at an altitude of 650m in the Alpes-Maritimes.



FIRST ORGANISATION

This is a second-time organization. We want you to discover the most beautiful panoramas of the hinterland of Monaco and Peille. You will discover the Col de Braus, the Collet des Boeufs, the Col de Brouis, the Col de Turini, Ligurian hilltop villages like Peille, Sainte Agnès, Moulinet, Sospel, La Turbie, the Fort de la Revère in Eze. And you will be traveling near the Mercantour Park and the Grande Corniche Departmental Park.

From 12 a.m. to 7 p.m.: Monaco Gravel Tour arrival at the foodtruck Mary Garden Place.

• Sunday, April 19 : [Monaco Gravel UCI]

From 8 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.: Monaco Gravel UCI bib distribution

From 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.: Team presentations - race briefing - placement in your respective pits - various instructions

From 2:00 p.m. to 4 p.m.: Arrival management

Between 3:30 p.m. and 4 p.m.: Prize giving at the Mary Garden Space

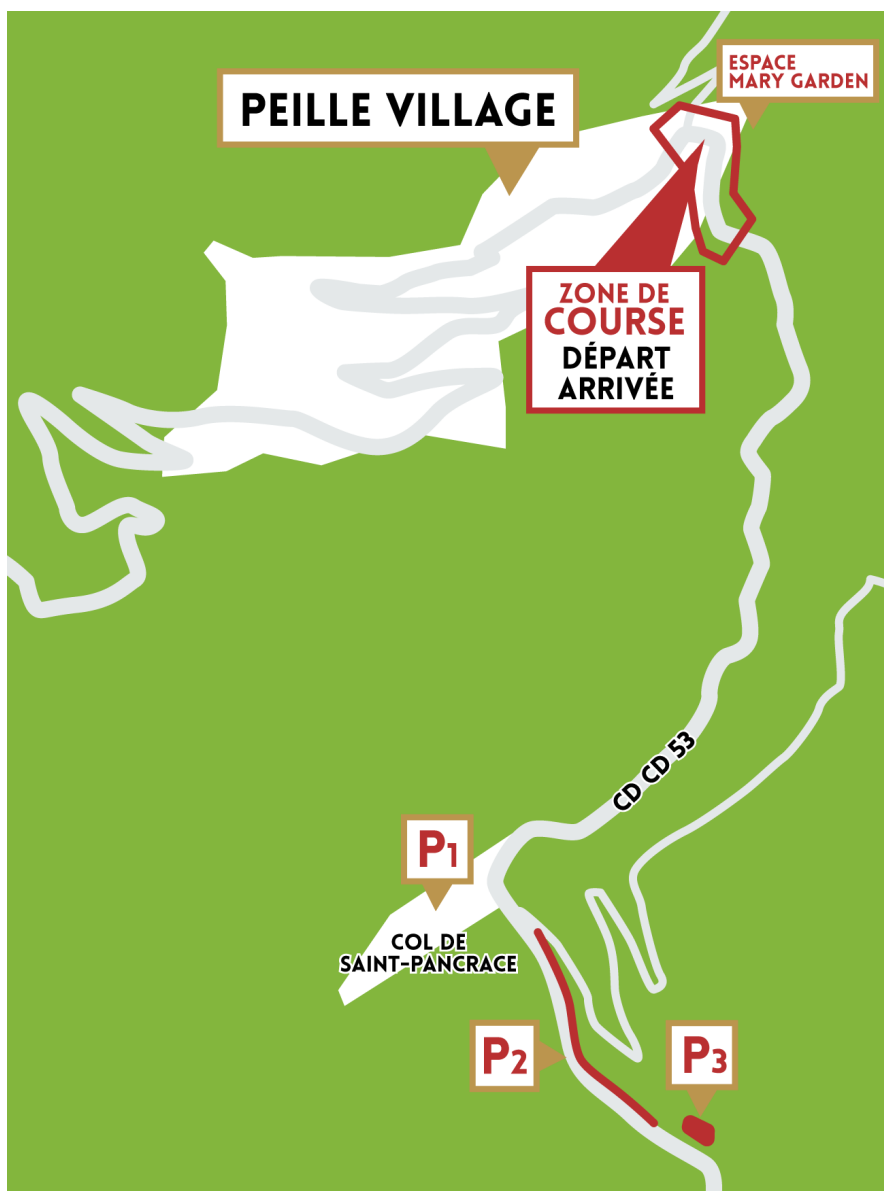
ORGANIZATION OF DEPARTURES :

Departures are organized freely from 8a.m. to 12p.m. You decide when you want to start. There are no group departures.

TIMING CHIP AND BIB

You will not be provided with a timing chip since this is not a timed race.

SITE MAP & PARKING



If you find parking spaces around the village of Peille, we encourage you to park there on Saturday for the duration of your adventure. Please note that the Mary Garden area is not a designated parking zone!

Here is the location at the Col Saint Pancrace where you can park without any problems:



(Click on the links)

P1: [Col Saint Pancrace nature area](#), 2km from the village of Peille.

P2: [Parking will be available along the roadside in an area of approximately 600m near the Col Saint Pancrace.](#) A traffic light will be in place to ensure parking safety.

P3: [Area P3 is reserved primarily for motorhomes requiring ample space.](#) It is a gravel parking area near the Col Saint Pancrace.

COMPLIANCE WITH THE HIGHWAY CODE AND SAFETY RULES :

Your adventure must be carried out in strict compliance with the highway code.

You must wear an EU-compliant cycling helmet.

You must start with at least 1 liter of water and an energy bar and/or gel of at least 500kcal.

You must be equipped in case of a puncture so that you can reach the finish area on your own in the event of a technical problem. In the event of a technical problem, no one will be able to pick you up.

All participants will start with a personalized event wristband that will display an emergency number in case of an accident.

You must follow the route independently using your GPS. The GPX track is available on the event website.

The rescue team will remain based at the Saint Pancrace Pass, in the start and finish area. They will be ready to go in the event of a serious accident! (Serious accident = fracture or something that prevents you from moving following a fall or other incident. Please do not have the rescue team relocated due to a technical problem! You are and will remain independent.)

You will be equipped with a bracelet with an emergency telephone number. This number will be used to screen calls to determine whether or not a rescue vehicle is dispatched.

You will need to have your cell phone with you for the duration of the adventure.

RESPECT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT :

You have the opportunity to experience a park and an exceptional natural setting.

If you participate, you must share our values of respect for the environment.

It goes without saying that you must not throw anything on the trails or roads after your visit. No packaging of any kind should be intentionally or accidentally discarded. We count on you to leave a clean record of your visit. You must keep any empty packaging that has been used with you.


SUPPLIES :

The organizers will not provide any refreshment points along the route.

You will remain completely self-sufficient. You can find water at fountains, as well as water and food as you pass through villages. You will find a variety of shops where you can stock up on supplies.

So, bring your credit card and some cash to make your purchases easier.

SECURITY CARD

You can see the safety points that will be installed along the route, thanks to a motorized vehicle and a first aid team. On the map, you can see them with this logo : 



You will wear a pink wristband during the event. This wristband will display an emergency number. This number can help you contact someone in the event of a serious accident. (Serious accident = fracture or something that prevents you from moving following a fall or other incident. Please do not send the emergency team out due to a technical issue! You are and remain independent.)

You can communicate your location so that an emergency vehicle can come to the scene. (Subject to phone reception in your area, as we are in the mountains and some locations do not have coverage.)

We ask that you bring your phone with you during the adventure so that we can call for help for yourself or a participant.



REQUIRED EQUIPMENT :

You are required to leave with this equipment :

- Cycling-specific GPS
- Whistle in case of falling into a ravine to alert emergency services. Carry this whistle on your person, not on your bike!
- Working red rear light
- Emergency blanket
- First aid kit (especially a bandage in case of severe bleeding)
- Waterproof jacket according to the day's weather
- Tire repair kit + multitool
- 1 liter of water
- 500kcal energy bar
- Your cell phone + ID card + credit card + cash
